Online Education

Offer three programs through Preparing for Amazement Ministries & Kairos University. These would have a monthly cost based on need and resource. A mentor team will be utilized for each program.

Certificate in Christian ministry

- 1. Complete basic training with Preparing for Amazement Ministries (15)
- 2. Complete at least 4 classes on Kairos in a year
- 3. Complete all master assessments

Bachelors in Christian ministry

- 1. Complete basic training with Preparing for Amazement Ministries (15)
- 2. Complete at least 16 classes on Kairos in four years
- 3. Complete all master assessments

Masters in Christian ministry

- 1. Complete basic training with Preparing for Amazement Ministries (15)
- 2. Complete at least 12 classes on Kairos in three years
- 3. Complete all master assessments

Charge for online education

- \$100 per month per student
 - Sponsorships up to just below the full amount
 - We pay Kairos their rate (\$30-\$50 per month)

Parameters for In Person Training Trips

- No more than 3 trips a year
- Trips are 10-17 days each: same continent, but different countries
- No more than 5 training visits with the same group (includes training the trainers)
- Minimum of 2 training days with each group on each trip. Maximum of 3.5
- 2-4 countries per trip
- Minimum of 30 participants from each group on each trip. Maximum of 100
- Each trip will have a set travel budget for trainers and a set support budget for each group being trained. These will be based on number of days, local economic factors and number of participants.

How we vet and Engage with New Partnerships

Warm Connection

An individual or group that we already know or is known by a trusted staff, board member, US pastor or other ministry partner.

Cool Connection

An individual or group that we have no warm connection (as described above) with.

Process for Vetting New Partnerships-Warm Connections

- 1. Share our ministry DNA and International program structure to ensure fit.
- 2. Cool Connection only-get three references.
- 3. Have potential new partner fill out a short application to be reviewed by staff.
- 4. Cool Connection only-get proof of validity of group with government, denomination, mission organization or other credible means.
- 5. Conduct a zoom interview/meeting to vet potential partner and determine feasibility of partnership.
- 6. Request additional information from the potential partner as deemed necessary.
- 7. Make an in person visit to partner ministry (staff member or designee) as deemed necessary.
- 8. Partnership to be approved by staff and board (as necessary).
- 9. Complete a partnership plan and begin planning initial trip.
