## MINISTRY IN KENYA

A few weeks ago, I had the privilege of traveling to Machakos, Kenya, to lead a pastors and leaders training that became one of the most impactful moments of my ministry so far.

We gathered 50 pastors and church leaders from across the region—some traveling nearly 200 kilometers just to attend. The hunger for learning was evident from the moment we began. Many of these leaders serve in rural areas where access to training is rare, and some have never had the opportunity to attend Bible school.

The day was not just about teaching—it was a rich time of fellowship. Pastors connected, exchanged stories, and encouraged one another, realizing they are not alone in their challenges and victories. At the close of the training, we awarded certificates to each participant.

The real fruit came two weeks later when I received a call from the host church's lead pastor. With joy in his voice, he told me that his congregation had been energized by what they learned. They began making disciples intentionally, and within a short time, their membership had doubled. He could hardly contain his gratitude and was already inviting us back for a second round of training.

For me, this wasn't just another ministry event—it was a reminder of my calling to go to the ends of the earth to revitalize the church. The impact in Machakos was just one step in what I believe will be a lifelong mission. We are not done yet. The work is just beginning.
